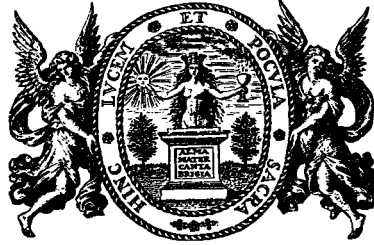

The authors examine in detail the farming regions of England and Wales, the agricultural techniques, and the improvements introduced. They then study the system of estate management pursued by the Crown, the Church, the nobility, the gentry and the yeomen.

Another chapter examines the condition of the farm labourer. A consideration of marketing methods, agricultural prices, farm profits and rents follows. Concluding chapters give an account of the improved standards of building and comfort in peasant houses.

The volume is illustrated by plans and photographs of farm houses, barns, and agricultural implements of the period, with numerous maps and tables. A statistical appendix gives prices for all the chief agricultural commodities.

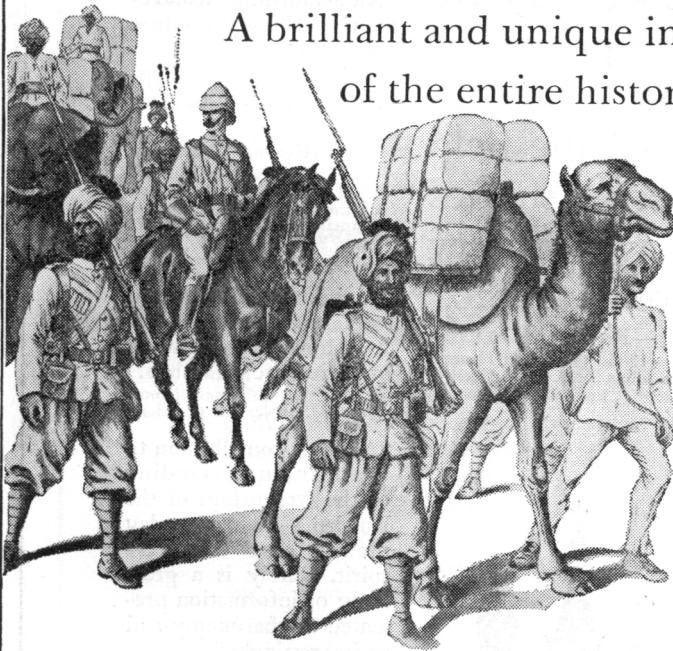

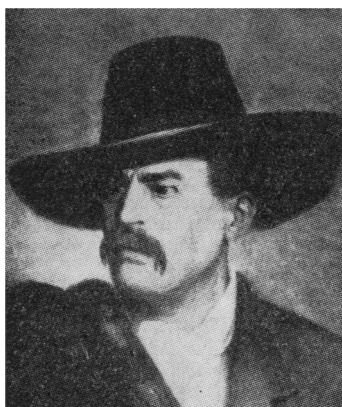

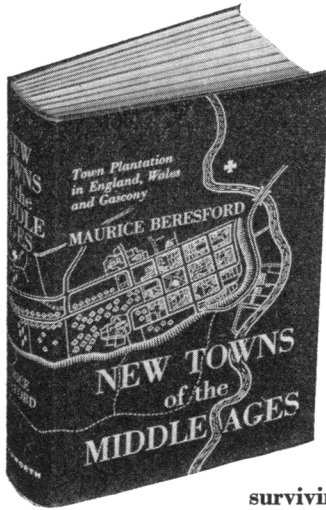
