NOTES ON CONTRIBUTORS

JEAN ALLMAN teaches African History at the University of Minnesota. In 1993 she published *The Quills of the Porcupine*; some of her recent studies of women in colonial Asante have appeared in *History Workshop Journal* (1994) and *Journal of African History* (1996).

DMITRI VAN DEN BERSSELAAR has been working since 1993 at the CNWS Research School at Leiden University. In 1994 and 1995–96 he did fieldwork for his doctoral study on 'Promoting Igbo language and culture: Igbo identity and nationalism 1900–1966'.

LAURA FAIR is an Assistant Professor of History at the University of Oregon, Eugene. She is currently revising for publication her 1994 doctoral dissertation 'Pastimes and Politics: a social history of Zanzibar's Ng'ambo community, 1890–1950'.

GUIDO GIARELLI is Professor of Medical Anthropology at the Postgraduate School of Medical Sociology in the University of Bologna.
