John Foxe's fame as a historiographer overshadowed his other writings and obscured many facets of his career. Professor Olsen evaluates Foxe as a theologian, historiographer, humanist, Erasmian, Anglican, Elizabethan Eusebius, Gospeller, Ecclesiologist, Erastian, precursor of Elizabethan nationalism, and Lutheran. Earlier studies tend to stress some of these aspects at the expense of others. Foxe, in fact, was all these things and still remained an independent thinker. While many were his mentors, he was the disciple of none.


