The 4th Canadian Neuro-Oncology Meeting will be held in Winnipeg, Manitoba from Friday, June 1st to Sunday, June 3rd, 1990.

Guest speakers include Dr. Douglas Arnold (Montreal, Neurological Institute) who will expand upon the applications of magnetic resonance imaging and spectroscopy as applied to primary intracranial neoplasms; Dr. Patrick Kelly (Rochester, Minnesota) will discuss novel surgical approaches/methods in respect to brain tumors; Dr. John Kepes (Kansas City) will be speaking on the pathology of meningiomas; and, Dr. Mark Rosenblum (San Francisco) will update the group on the exciting advances in the molecular biology of brain tumors.
