The principal dependent variable was a composite based upon respondents' reported political activities, coded 0 thru 6. All variables specified are statistical significance ( $p < .05$ ); other indicators are omitted from final calculation. Missing values among observations were imputed using full-information maximum likelihood estimation (FIML),  $N = 1846$ .
