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The first three articles of this issue make up a unit and were so presented at the Southern Historical Association annual meeting in Atlanta, November 8-11, 1967, under the title "The Search for Identity: Two Very Different Approaches."

In a broader context, all of the articles which follow in this number of the *Journal* deal with the same haunting pervasive theme: the yearning of individuals and peoples to find themselves and the answers to some of the big questions of life. In a busy, complicated world devoted to gadgets and engines, land reform programs and systems analyses, population explosions and development problems, it is refreshing to remember that man does not live by bread alone, and to ponder the means by which he seeks to nourish his soul and his mind.
