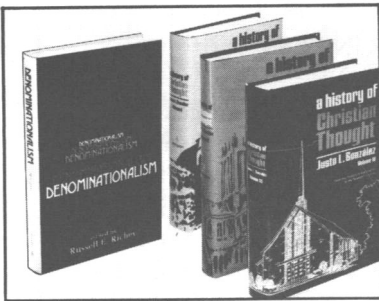


PHILIP SCHAFF PRIZE

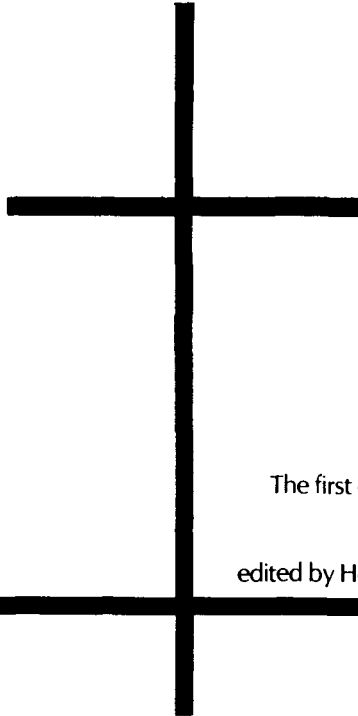
