ANNOUNCEMENT

The Eighth In-Service Training and Continuing Self-Assessment Examination in Neurology will be given throughout the United States and Canada on Saturday, May 16, 1981. The examination will consist of approximately 480 multiple-choice questions, utilizing the format of the National Board of Medical Examiners, and will cover the following areas: (1) clinical neurology, (2) pediatric neurology, (3) neuroanatomy, (4) neuropathology, (5) Neuropharmacology, (6) neurophysiology (including EEG and EMG), and (7) neuroradiology. The examination will be given at centers with neurology training programs. The examination is thorough and clinically relevant.

House officers, faculty, and practitioners in related fields are invited to take the examination on this date at a designated neurologic training center. Results of the examination will be provided only to the individual taking the examination. Anonymity will be preserved.

An additional feature following this examination will be the provision of the "keyword" report to each individual listing the area covered in each question answered incorrectly.

Cost of the examination will be \$50 for house officers and \$100 for others. A \$5 Advance Registration Discount will apply on all applications received on or before March 6, 1981. Deadline for receipt of applications is March 25, 1981.

A cancellation fee of \$10 will be charged each written cancellation received on or before May 13, 1981. No other cancellation requests will be honored.

Fourteenth Annual RECENT ADVANCES IN NEUROLOGY

February 11 - 13, 1981
San Francisco, California

This annual program is designed to provide a review of clinical neurology with special emphasis on areas in which advances in understanding have occurred or progress in patient management has been made. Subjects to be discussed will include: clinical applications of new concepts in the pathogenesis of the dementias, myotonia, disorders of eye movement, anomia, aphasia, cerebellar function, and the behavioral disorders that accompany epilepsy; diagnosis and management of the

patient with thoracic outlet syndrome, cerebral venous sinus thrombosis, intracranial angioma, narcolepsy, TIA's, CNS infection accompanying immunosuppression, hypothermia, and mitral valve prolapse. The applications and limitations of CT scanning and positron emission tomography (PET) will also be covered.
