

PMLA (ISSN 0030-8129) is published five times a year, in January, March, May, October, and November, by the Modern Language Association of America. Membership in the association is open to persons who are professionally interested in the modern languages and literatures. Annual (calendar-year) dues, which include subscription to PMLA, are \$20 for graduate student members (up to a maximum of seven years) and are based on income for regular members: income under \$15,000, \$25; income \$15,000-\$20,000, \$40; income \$20,000-\$30,000, \$50; income \$30,000-\$40,000, \$70; income \$40,000-\$50,000, \$85; income \$50,000-\$60,000, \$100; income \$60,000-\$70,000, \$115; income \$170,000-\$130; income \$10,000-\$100; oncome \$10,000-\$120,000, \$165; income \$120,000-\$140,000, \$185; income \$120,000-\$160,000, \$230; income \$180,000-\$200,000, \$255; income ver \$200,000, \$280. Joint membership, which provides one copy of the January, March, May, and October issues of PMLA but two copies of all other publications, is available to two individuals sharing the same household. The dues for a joint membership are \$40 above the dues that would be paid by the higher-income member alone. Foreign members pay the same as regular members (use the American-dollar equivalent to ascertain the dues category). Membership applications are available on request and at the MLA Web site (www.mla.org).

For libraries and other institutions, a subscription in 2012 to the electronic format of *PMLA* alone is \$180 and to the print and electronic formats is \$200 (domestic and Canadian) or \$225 (foreign). Subscriptions include the annual volume of *Profession*, the MLA's journal of opinion about the modern language profession, in the same medium or media as *PMLA*. They also include online access to the 2002–11 volumes of both journals. For an additional \$170, institutional subscribers receive a cloth-bound edition of the 2012 volume of *PMLA*. Agents deduct four percent as their fee. Claims for undelivered issues will be honored if they are received within six months of the publication date; thereafter the single-issue price will be charged. Single copies of the January, March, May, and October issues can be purchased for \$12 each; the November (Program) issue is \$35.
