WHOLE-TIME COURSES FOR POSTGRADUATE STUDENTS

17 February–24 May 1969 and 5 August–1 November 1969

BASIC SCIENCES CLASS for Part I D.L.O. students.

This consists of approximately 50 lecture/demonstrations on the anatomy of the head, neck, thorax and brain; 20 lectures covering the physiological aspects; 6 on applied pharmacology; and 8 on histological and pathological and bacteriological subjects. Facilities are also available for dissection of the relevant parts, and this occupies about 120 hours.

6 January–15 February 1969 and 30 June–9 August 1969

INTENSIVE CLINICAL LECTURE PERIOD for Part II D.L.O. and other students.

These periods are primarily designed to give a clinical survey of the whole field of the Specialty as a preliminary to practical clinical training. At the completion of the Intensive Lecture Period, selected students may be given the opportunity to serve as house surgeons in the associated hospitals.

19 May–31 May 1969 and 5 November–18 November 1969

PRACTICAL REVISION CLASS for Part II D.L.O. students.

This is intended for those students who are well advanced in preparation for the examination and need only the opportunity for a final review. The class includes demonstrations of selected clinical cases and viva voce examinations.

17 March–29 March 1969 and 29 September–11 October 1969

This is limited to senior students who are about to take the Final examination. In addition to a series of lecture/discussions at the appropriate level in the Specialty and in related branches of general surgery, there are a number of clinical and viva voce sessions and arrangements for the setting and correction of test papers.

which are arranged from time to time can be obtained from the Secretary-Administrator.

The clinical practice can be joined at any time by individual arrangement with the Dean.

This includes daily practical teaching in the clinics and operating theatres and ward-rounds and special demonstrations weekly.

Demonstrations of clinical cases, open clinical lectures and clinical pathological conferences are held at regular intervals throughout the year, and are open without fee to all trainees in the Specialty. A list giving dates and times is obtainable in the Secretary-Administrator's office.

SHORT COURSES FOR CONSULTANTS AND SENIOR REGISTRARS

1 month commencing 2 June 1969

Post-Fellowship Advanced Specialty.

Training Course in Otolaryngology.

(Consultants and Registrars in the National Health Service are eligible for grant of study leave with pay and expenses to attend these courses.)

INTENSIVE COURSE IN OTOLOGIC SURGERY

An intensive course in Otolgic Surgery will be held 12-16 January 1970, by the Los Angeles Foundation of Otology and the University of Southern California School of Medicine in co-operation with St. Vincent's Hospital. This course will consist of lectures, televised surgery, and motion pictures.

One day will be devoted to otosclerosis surgery and 3 days to surgery of chronic ear disease. One day will be devoted to inner-ear problems, glomus tumours, and facial nerve paralysis.

A tuition fee of \$300, payable at the time of application in U.S. currency, to the Los Angeles Foundation of Otology, includes the cost of the noon luncheons.

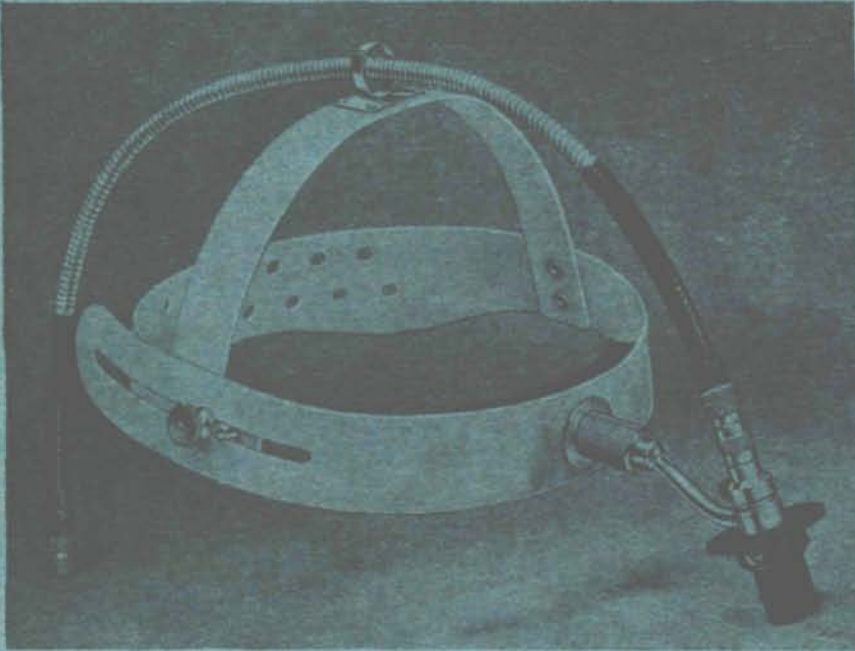
