Manuscripts should not exceed 10,000 words and for their return be accompanied by postage.

BOOK REVIEWS evaluate the scholarship of books and demonstrate their contribution and relevance to other literature. Books in all areas of British, Irish, and imperial history will be considered for review. Albion does not accept unsolicited book reviews and does not underwrite the opinions of its reviewers. Persons interested in writing reviews should send a *Curriculum Vita* to the editor. Books for review and all related correspondence are to be sent to the editor. Proposals for review essays concerning the historiography of a field, era, or important theme in British history should be communicated to the editor.
