

## ERRATA

A phrase was erroneously transposed in "Punishment and Social Organization: A Study of Durkheim's Theory of Penal Evolution" by Steven Spitzer, which appeared in Volume 9, No. 4 of *Law & Society Review*. The sentence beginning on line 31, p. 632, and the sentence immediately following it, should read as follows:

These emerging states come to rely on powerful collective definitions and naked force because they have neither 'models to build on or to reject' (Fried, 1967:232), nor do they have other means of exacting obedience and labor power. While market economies (which Durkheim described as 'organic society') may use 'laws of the market' to regulate labor and institutionalize inequality, redistributive economies (Polanyi, 1944) must resort to political and ideological controls to support the concentration of wealth.

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
