THE LAW OF MARITIME DELIMITATION - REFLECTIONS

The problem of maritime delimitation is one of the most disputed questions in international law. Out of the several hundred situations calling for maritime delimitation, only about a hundred have so far been settled. Numerous negotiations are under way, and several cases will come before international tribunals over the next few years.

The purpose of this book is to assess the meaning and scope of the solutions already reached, to submit them to a critical analysis, to identify the directions in which the evolution of the law is headed, and to advance some suggestions as to desirable developments. Particularly in the light of the judgment of the International Court of Justice in the Libya-Malta case, Professor Weil argues cogently in favour of equidistance as a starting point, modified as necessary by reference to equitable considerations.

The latest volume of the *Yearbook* (63-I, 1989), which has just been published, contains the preparatory work for the next session of the Institute, which will be held in September 1989 in Santiago-de-Compostela (Spain).

This preparatory work was undertaken by specialized Commissions and includes the reports of the rapporteurs and comments by Commission members on the following major issues (in English or French, as the case may be):

“Contemporary problems concerning the jurisdictional immunity of States” (*Rapporteur: Professor Ian Brownlie*). The discussion had begun at the previous session (Cairo, 1987 and the Rapporteur has submitted a Supplementary Report.

“Arbitration between States and foreign enterprises” (*Rapporteur: Professor Arthur von Mehren, Co-Rapporteur: Judge Eduardo Jiménez de Aréchaga*).

“Equality of treatment of the *lex fori* in national codifications of private international law” (*Rapporteur: Professor Pierre Gannagé*).

“Protection of human rights and the principle of nonintervention in the domestic affairs of States” (*Rapporteur: Professor Giuseppe Sperduti*).

The discussions, conclusions and resolutions on these issues will be published in the following volume (63-II), after the conclusion of the Santiago-de-Compostela session.

The Institute of International Law brings together 132 members and associate members selected from the world's most eminent specialists of public and private international law. The conclusions that have emerged from its meetings every 2 years have had a notable impact on the development and codification of international law.
