He was a visiting research fellow in 2010 at the Leibniz Institute of European History in Mainz. He received the 2013 Essay Prize of the German History Society and the Royal Historical Society, and he has published articles in *The English Historical Review* and *German History*.

GEORGE WILLIAMSON is associate professor of history at Florida State University (Department of History, Florida State University, MC2200, Tallahassee, FL, 32306; email: gwilliamson@fsu.edu). He is the author of *The Longing for Myth in Germany: Religion and Aesthetic Culture from Romanticism to Nietzsche* (2004). He is currently completing a book titled, “August von Kotzebue: A Political History, 1789–1819.”

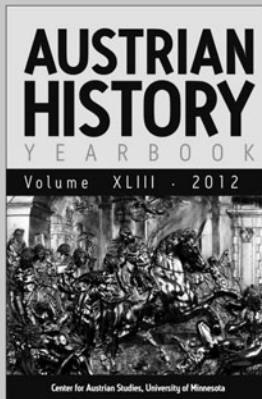
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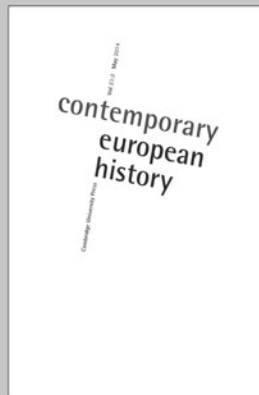
