- ◆ a library of around 110,000 volumes and 580 current periodicals, maintained jointly with the Hellenic Society and in conjunction with the University of London's Institute of Classical Studies. It has an international reputation as one of the world's foremost Classics lending libraries. It also houses a lending collection of over 6,700 slides
- ◆ summer schools, etc. by the annual award of grants
- ◆ archaeology, through grants for excavations and by organising a biennial conference
- ◆ schools, by the award of grants to help the teaching of all aspects of the Roman world
- ◆ a programme of public lectures in London, lectures outside London arranged with local branches of the Classical Association, and other occasional events of general interest

Membership is open to all; no entrance fee or professional qualification is required. Members are entitled to:

- ◆ receive annually either the *JRS* or *Britannia* or both, and, as an optional extra, a CD-ROM version
- ◆ have access (for an extra fee) to JSTOR's electronic archive of the back volumes of both journals (see outside back cover)
- ◆ receive advance notice of forthcoming monographs at special offer prices
- ◆ use the library and borrow the Society's books and slides, either in person or by post, while living or resident in the UK
- ◆ attend the Society's lectures and other events, of which a programme is circulated in September
- ◆ purchase back issues of the journals (see back page)
