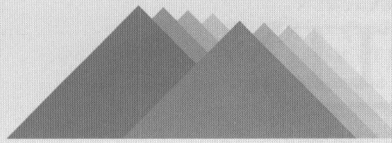

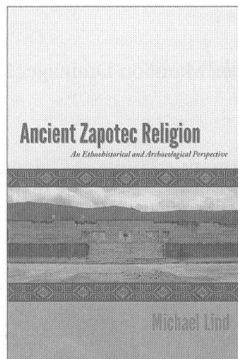

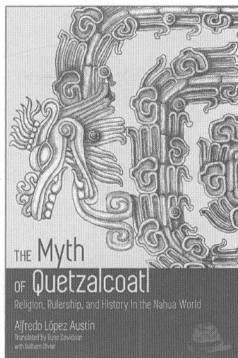
Ancient Zapotec Religion

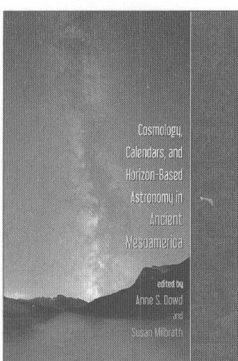
