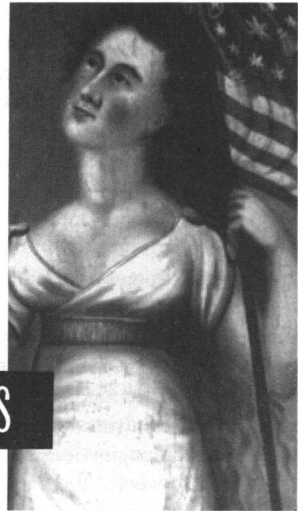

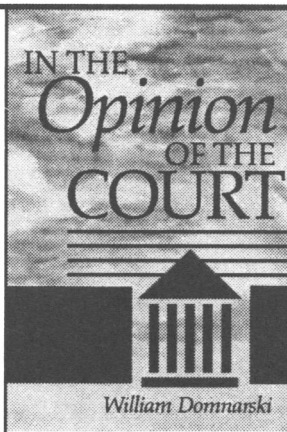

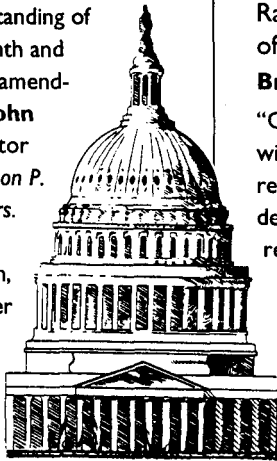

Tristram Kennedy and the Revival of Irish Legal Training, 1835-1885

Recalling the existence of an ancient

and elaborate system of brehon legal education, Kenny notes that little or no training was provided for lawyers within Ireland between the Tudor destruction of Gaelic society and the Victorian era. The political and professional processes which led finally to the revival of legal training in the nineteenth century and the part played in that revival by Tristan Kennedy are described. Particular attention is paid to the Dublin Law Institute which Kennedy founded and which he ran with the active support of the great educational reformer, Thomas Wyse.
