**Peace-Making and The Settlement With Japan**

Unlike previous treaties signed after major wars, the Japanese peace treaty (signed in 1951) did not come into being at a quiet moment of impending peace. Again, departing from the usual, a bitter war-time enemy had suddenly become, by conscious design a "peace-time" ally. What were the reasons for this almost revolutionary departure from prior policy? What obstacles stood in its way? How was it accomplished? What can be learned from it? Professor Dunn answers these questions and more. In concluding, he considers the effect of settlement on the security of the Western powers since the treaty went into effect.
