THE main aims of the Classical Association are to promote and sustain interest in classical studies, to maintain their rightful position in universities and schools, and to give scholars and teachers opportunities of meeting and discussing their problems. It organizes an annual conference, lasting four or five days, in a university centre, and sponsors some thirty branches, most of which hold Greek and Latin Reading Competitions for Schools. Its activities are fully reported in its annual *Proceedings*, issued free to all members.




