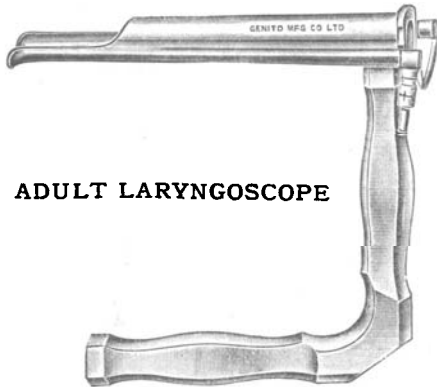

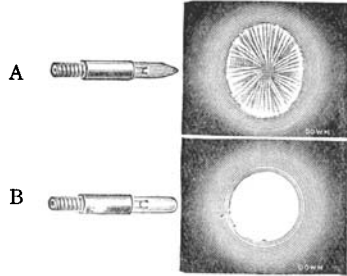

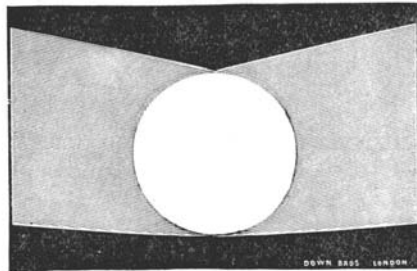
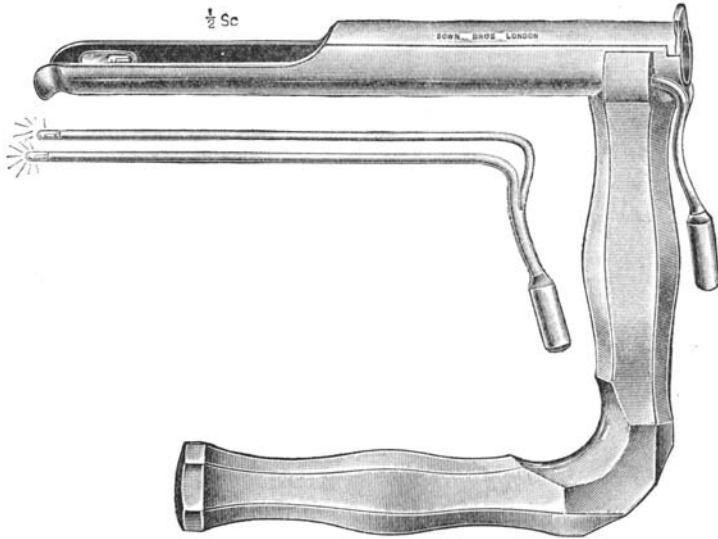
**NEW BRONCHOSCOPIC LAMPS**

9. An Annual Subscription can be commenced with any number of the Journal, and the preceding numbers of the current year can be purchased at Four Shillings each.

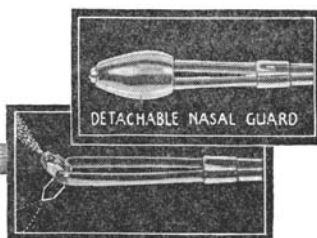
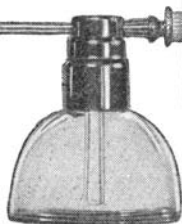

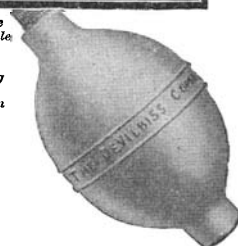
