

**ANNOUNCEMENT.****INTERNATIONAL GEOLOGICAL CONGRESS.**

The Executive Committee for the Congress of 1940 have issued a second circular, containing some points of importance to intending participants. The General Session will be held in London from 31st July to 8th August, and as usual there are many excursions before, during, and after the Congress. Notice is given of some alterations in the scheme of excursions, with addition of extra ones not listed in the first circular. The membership fee has been fixed at £1 10s., and it is stated that the Executive Committee do not desire to receive membership fees at the present time.

The titles of papers to be presented at the Congress must be in the hands of the General Secretaries, Dr. W. F. P. McLintock and Professor W. B. R. King, not later than 1st June, and the MSS. by 1st July, 1940, in a typewritten form, with illustrations, etc., ready for publication.

The list of excursions is extraordinarily comprehensive. There can scarcely be a point of geological interest in the whole of Great Britain which will not be visited by one or more of them, under the guidance of the leading specialists in each case, and there is also an excursion to the east of Ireland, composed of two parties travelling over the same ground in opposite directions. The same plan is adopted in other instances, so as to increase the possible number of those taking part.
