HUANG HSING AND MODERN CHINA

Essays from an International Symposium

黄興與近代中國 學術討論會論文集

(Taipei, Taiwan: Graduate School of History, Chengchi University, 1993. 505 pp. N. p.)

Twenty-one articles originally presented at a symposium on Huang Hsing, who was one of the two most important leaders of the Republican Revolution that overthrew the Manchu dynasty. The conference was jointly sponsored by the Huang Hsing Foundation (USA),* Chengchi University, Academia Historica and other institutions in Taiwan in May 1992. It was the first time PRC scholars visited Taiwan for an academic conference.

This impressive and beautifully printed volume deals with various aspects of Huang's life, personality, military leadership and political thought. His pragmatism and views on modernization, democracy and party politics might still be more relevant to China today than heretofore recognized. The scholarly and objective reexamination of Huang's role by some of the most eminent historians in Taiwan is a refreshing departure from the heretofore orthodox Kuomintang historiography.

*The Huang Hsing Foundation (USA) was established as a non-profit organization by Chün tu Hsüeh 薛君度 to provide support to qualified individuals and institutions in the United States and abroad in the fields of modern Chinese history, social sciences, humanities and the arts. It has established the Huang Hsing Foundation Distinguished Lectureship in Beijing and at Berkeley (University of California), and arrangements are being made to establish a similar program at Oxford, New Delhi and Tokyo. Henry Luce III, Chairman and CEO of the Henry Luce Foundation, and four other distinguished international figures serve on the Board of Advisers. As a rule, the foundation does not consider personal applications; they are generally processed through institutions. It has received no funding from any government or government-related sources.

PURPOSE AND ORGANIZATION

The Association for Asian Studies is a scholarly, non-political, and non-profit professional association open to all persons interested in Asia and the study of Asia. It seeks through publications, meetings, and seminars to facilitate contact and exchange of information among scholars and to increase understanding of Asia. The Association for Asian Studies is the largest society of its kind in the world. Its 7,000 members include scholars, teachers, business people, diplomats, journalists, and interested laypersons.

Founded in 1941 as the Far Eastern Association, the organization was renamed the Association for Asian Studies in 1957 to reflect the wider geographic interests of its membership. In 1970, four elective area Councils—South Asia, Southeast Asia, China and Inner Asia, and Northeast Asia—were established to guarantee each area constituency its own representation and a proportionate voice on the Board of Directors. In 1977, a Council of Conferences was established as a liaison with eight regional conferences throughout the United States to serve the needs of those interested in Asian studies in different parts of the country. The Association is a member of the American Council of Learned Societies and the National Council of Area Studies Associations, actively participating with its sister societies in a wide range of activities, including joint participation in research and informational exchanges.

Publications of the Association include The Journal of Asian Studies, the Bibliography of Asian Studies, Doctoral Dissertations on Asia, the Asian Studies Newsletter, the Monograph Series, and committee publications.
