## Biographies of Speakers



### VICTOR ABRAMOVICH

Victor Abramovich holds a Law Degree by the Faculty of Law (UBA) and LLM from American University in Washington, DC. He is the Executive Secretary of the Institute of Public Policy on Human Rights (IPPDDHH). He was a member of the Inter-American Commission on Human Rights, Executive Director of the Center for Legal and Social Studies, consultant to the Inter-American Development Bank, legal adviser to the Ombudsman of the city of Buenos Aires and consultant to the American Institute of Human Rights. He teaches human rights in the UBA and the National University of Lanús, where he directs the Master of Human Rights, a visiting professor at American University and author of many papers, especially on economic, social and cultural rights.



### AGOSTINA ALLORI

Agostina Allori received her Lawyer degree from Universidad de San Andrés. Currently she works as clerk at the Office of International Cooperation in Criminal Matters, and International Relations of the National Chief Prosecutor's Office of Argentina. She is also research assistant of professors Martín Böhmer and José Luis Galimidi at the Universidad de San Andrés, and has been an Intern of the Observatory of Gender Justice in the Judicial Council of the City of Buenos Aires.



### DANIEL RICARDO ALTMARK

Daniel Altmark studied law at the Universidad de Buenos Aires where he also has a doctor in juris degree. Altmark is a specialist in telecommunication and informatic law matters and is Director of Legislative Projects Unit Planning, Faculty of Law of the UBA. He was the Executive Coordinator of the Argentine Legal Digest Project.

**MATÍAS BAILONE**

Matías Bailone is a postdoctoral researcher at the Institute of European and International Criminal Law at the University of Castilla - La Mancha (Spain). Doctor of laws in Criminal Sciences from the University of San Carlos of Guatemala, Lawyer and Human Rights Specialist in Democratization Processes (University of Chile and International Center for Transitional Justice, 2007). Lawyer Specialist Shariah and International Criminal Law (University of Palermo, Italy, and Istituto Superiore Internazionale di Scienze Criminale, Siracusa, Italy, 2008). He is currently Legal Secretary at the Supreme Court of the Nation, where he works at the Research Area. He is a member of the International Academic Network for the Abolition of Capital Punishment and co-editor of the journal 'Research' of the Supreme Court of Justice of the Nation (Argentina).

**LIC. ELSA BARBER**

Elsa Barber is the Assistan Director of the Biblioteca Nacional Argentina (National Library). She holds a Degree in Librarianship and a PhD in Philosophy. Her publications include the translation of the work of FW Lancaster, and intense work in the automation processes in the university libraries in Argentina. She has also published articles on education in librarianship in the information society. She is a member of the Advisory Council of the Library since March 2006.

**PAOLA BERGALLO**

Paola Bergallo is a professor at Universidad de Palermo in Buenos Aires, Argentina. She holds a LL.B. with honors from the Universidad de Buenos Aires and a Master of Laws from Columbia University. She completed a Master in Legal Research and a J.S.D. from Stanford University. Prof. Bergallo was a Fellow at Hewlett Foundation and Stanford University (2004-2005). Prof. Bergallo has held several visiting positions at Universidad Pompeu Fabra, Barcelona, at Universidad de Puerto Rico, and at Instituto Tecnológico Autónomo de México (ITAM), México. She has worked as researcher and consultant in projects of the



Centro de Estudios de Estado y Sociedad (CEDES), the Center for Reproductive Rights, the UN Fund for Population (UNFPA) and the Pan-American Health Organization (PAHO) on gender and law, women human rights and sexual and reproductive rights. Prof. Bergallo is a founding member of Red Alas, Red de Académicas Latinoamericanas.

Ramón Brenna holds a *cum laude* law degree from the University of Buenos Aires and is a specialist in informatic law matters. 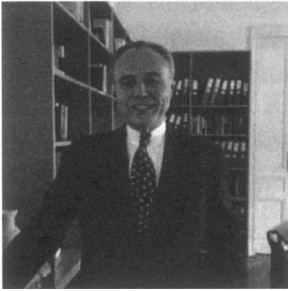
of Argentina.

equality.



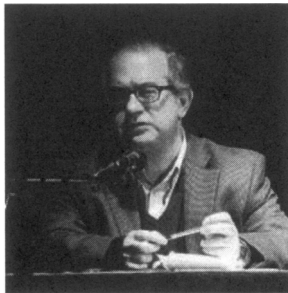
### **SANTOS GOÑI**

Judicial Reform Project. Funded by the United States Agency for International Development (USAID). Graduate Professor of the National Universities of Buenos Aires, La Plata, La Pampa and Northeast. Graduate Professor at the

University of Palermo (Buenos Aires). Full Time Professor of the School of Law at the Universidad Torcuato Di Tella. Advocate consultant for various studies in cases of a criminal nature. He is author or coauthor of several books, including “The Right to Free Expression.”



#### **ELENA HIGHTON DE NOLASCO**

Elena Highton de Nolasco is an Argentine lawyer, judge and currently Vice-president of the Supreme Court of Justice of Argentina since 2005. Highton has a law degree (Universidad de Buenos Aires – UBA). She has postgraduate studies from UBA, Harvard Law School and the University of Nevada. In 1979 she became a judge, joining the national Appeals Court in 1994. She taught extensively particularly at UBA, and has written several books largely on civil law. The International Association of Women Judges (IAWJ) awarded her the Human Rights Award during a conference held in Seoul on 18 May 2010.



#### **MARIA ÁNGELES JAIMES RONDINE**

Maria Ángeles Jaime Rondine is Librarian (Library School. Faculty of Philosophy and Humanities, National University of Córdoba). She is Assistant Professor and technical secretary of the School of Library Science at the Universidad de Córdoba. Additionally she serves as Technical Secretary of the Academic Department of Visual Arts. Faculty of Arts, National University of Cordoba



#### **ALEJANDRA NARDI**

Alejandra Nardi holds a degree in Library and Information Science and an MA in “Educational Processes mediated through Technologies”, (National University of Córdoba - UNC). She is the Director of the “Office Open Knowledge” at UNC and also a Professor at the Faculty of Humanities (UNC). 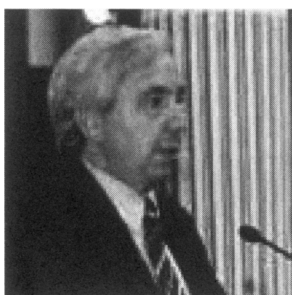
#### **MERCEDES URIOSTE**

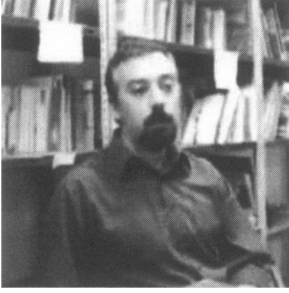
#### **JUAN VALLE RALEIGH**

Federico Villegas Beltrán is Director General of Human Rights at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Worship of Argentina. (1995 to 2003), dealing with human rights issues before the Inter-American System of Human Rights; and disarmament desk at the Department of Nuclear, Space and International Security Affairs at the MFA.

**FEDERICO ZEBALLOS**

Federico Zeballos holds a Degree in Library and Documentation from the Universidad Nacional de Córdoba (UNC) where he is also an Assistant Professor of Sources and Services. He was awarded with several scholarships, oriented in the research process in information and human rights. 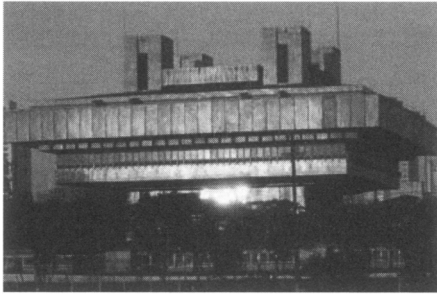

### **BIBLIOTECA NACIONAL DE LA REPÚBLICA ARGENTINA**

#### *National Library of the Argentine Republic*

The opening reception will take place in the Biblioteca Nacional de la República Argentina (National Library of the Argentine Republic). Founded in September 1810, it is the largest library in Argentina. Its historical importance transcends its cultural contribution to society and becomes part of the testimony of the history of Argentina. It was directed by, among others, renowned intellectuals Paul Groussac and Jorge Luis Borges.



### **ARCHIVO NACIONAL DE LA MEMORIA**

#### *National Archive of Memory*

The Archivo Nacional de la Memoria (National Archive of Memory). This archive is located in the former School of Naval Mechanics (exESMA). In 2003 the building became a space dedicated to the acquisition and processing of data pertaining to human rights violations by the Argentine State during the last dictatorship (1976-1983), and as a space for the promotion of human rights in



the country. Visiting this archive will be a sober reminder of the costs of freedom, and need for preserving its record for future generations.



### **BIBLIOTECA DE LA CORTE SUPREMA DE JUSTICIA DE LA NACIÓN**

#### ***Library of the Supreme Court of the Nation***

The Supreme Court of Argentina (in Spanish, Corte Suprema de Justicia de la Nación) is the highest court of law of the Argentine Republic. It was inaugurated on 15 January 1863. The Palace of Justice was designed by French architect Norbert Maillart in 1906, and was initially inaugurated in 1910. Subsequent works, both logistical and aesthetic, continued until 1942, and among its most noteworthy monuments are Justice, by Rogelio Yrurtia, and José de San Martín, by Luis Perloti.
