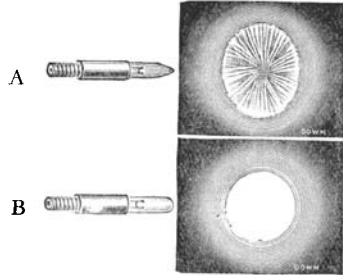

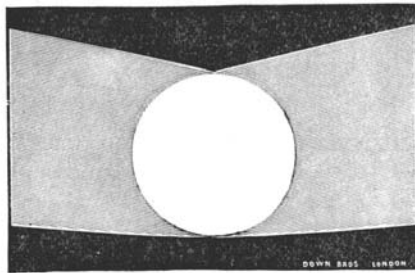
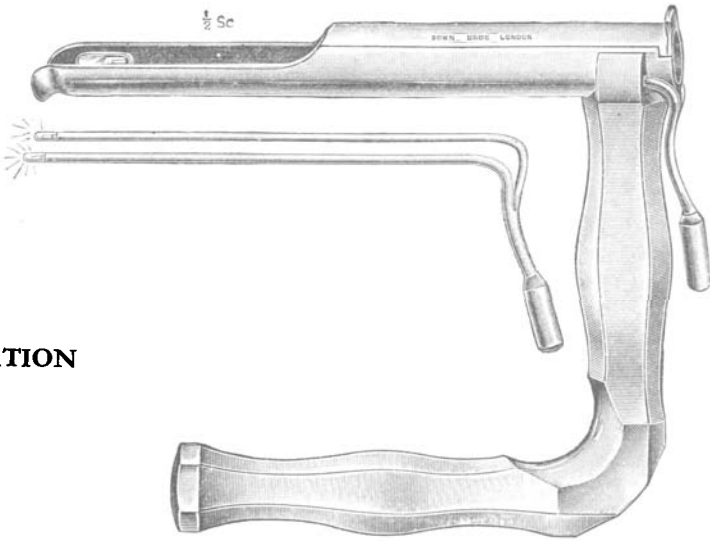
DOWN BROS.' New Bronchoscopic Lamps

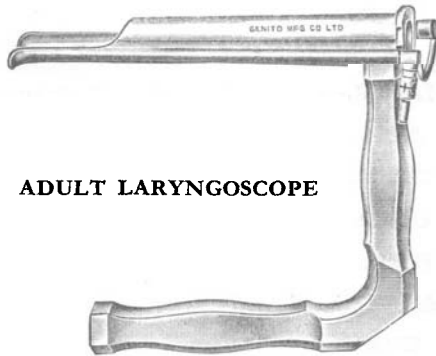




**NEGUS' ENDOSCOPIC TABLE

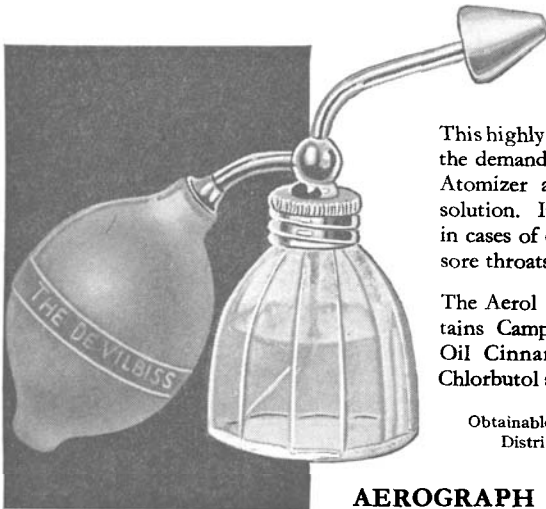
