A TWO-PART COURSE—JUNE 1981

PART A—VESTIBULAR FUNCTION

PART B—AUDITORY ELECTROPHYSIOLOGY

FROM 1330 ON WEDNESDAY, 17 JUNE TO 1700 ON FRIDAY, 19 JUNE

ORGANIZED BY THE INSTITUTE OF SOUND AND VIBRATION RESEARCH  
AUDIOLOGY GROUP AT ROOM 3.08 TIZARD ENGINEERING BUILDING

The Course is intended for otolaryngologists, neurologists, chief physiological measurement technicians and audiological scientists.

PART A—will cover theoretical and practical aspects of vestibular function and dysfunction and there will be a discussion of the neurologist's role in the investigation of the dizzy patient. The practical sessions will give participants the opportunity to observe and gain experience in a wide range of tests of vestibular and optic-optomotor function.

PART B—The lectures and practical demonstrations will cover the range of auditory evoked potentials and techniques, ranging from trans tympanic electrocochleography through to cortical potential. In each instance the recording methodology, response interpretation and clinical applications will be dealt with.

For practical reasons the Course number will be limited to 20.

Whilst it is hoped that applicants will register for the complete course of five days, you may take either part.

No accommodation is available in a student hall, as the Course is in term-time, but help will be offered in finding suitable hotel accommodation.

Coffee, lunch and tea will be served daily.

The cost of the complete week will be approximately £200, or £120 for Part A and £120 for Part B. This sum includes registration, a comprehensive set of lecture notes, lunch and refreshments.
