'HAZELINE'

BRAND OF DISTILLED WITCH HAZEL.



FROM the fresh green bark of the *Hamamelis virginica* the North American Indians prepared a decoction which possessed remarkable sedative, astringent and styptic properties. Attempts have been made to manufacture extracts, tinctures, etc., from the dried imported bark, but no real measure of success has been attained. 'Hazeline' however, a distillate of the fresh green bark, retains the valuable properties of the plant. It is rapidly replacing the tinctures of iron and myrrh, whilst it is superior to tincture of arnica as a local application. 'Hazeline' does not stain anything with which it is brought into contact.

A little, diluted with four or five times the quantity of tepid water, makes a very soothing and cleansing lotion. As an astringent or as a spray it may be applied either with or without dilution. Externally it is used as a dressing upon absorbent cotton wool, as an embrocation, and for cold compresses. For hot compresses, sprinkle freely on flannel freshly wrung out of hot water. Internally the dose is 60 to 180 drops in water, repeated as may be necessary.
