International Law, National Tribunals, and the Rights of Aliens

When an individual's person or property is injured or taken by a foreign country, the usual course is to seek relief or recompense from that country through its courts before attempting to persuade his own country to make it a diplomatic or international legal matter. Today there are many more individuals traveling or residing outside their own nations than ever before, subject to a wide variety of legal prescriptions often quite unlike the legal systems of their own countries. A practical guide through the legal labyrinth has long been needed, and this book is designed to provide it.

The authors examined the written law in 24 of the leading countries representing the world's major legal systems, and then visited those countries to see how the laws work in practice in relation to aliens. African, South American, Asian, and European countries were studied, as were Great Britain, Canada, Australia, and the United States.

The result is a book of significant value to individuals and corporations, and to international lawyers representing corporate clients—a handy and concise treatment of the major legal, as well as non-legal, problems confronting the enforcement of the rights of aliens in foreign countries.

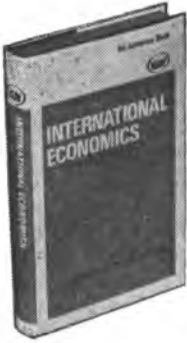

Such topics as the balance of payments, the working of the IMF, the pros and cons of a fluctuating exchange rate, European integration, and the trade problems of less developed countries are dealt with in some detail. Although the book is intended primarily as a text, the discussion of recent developments in trade theory will appeal to the expert.

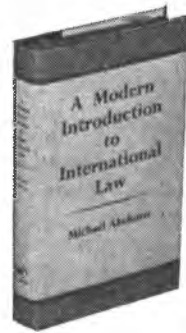

A Modern Introduction to International Law

This new work emphasizes the relationship between international law and current international politics. It contains judicious discussion of Vietnam, the invasion of Czechoslovakia, Britain's Commonwealth Immigrant Acts, etc. It also deals at length with continued controversies in international law (e. g., expropriation of foreign-owned property, fishery limits, and colonialism) where the conflicting national interests and attitudes are most apparent. Special attention is also devoted to "new" areas of international law, such as the legal rules regarding outer space and the ocean floor.

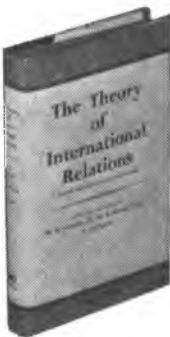
The Theory of International Relations

This book offers selections from the great writings of the past on international relations. It ranges from the views of Grotius, Rousseau, and Kant to those of relatively less well-known figures such as Gentili, Gentz, and Treitschke. All the passages have a common theme; they search for the essence of interstate relations. This quest carries the reader into investigations of the causes of war, the balance of power, the relationship between international relations and the political theory of the state, and related major issues.

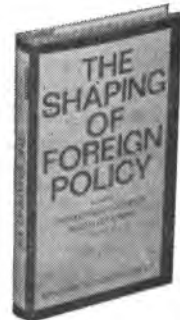


The Shaping of Foreign Policy

Egypt Under Nasir is a comprehensive study of Egyptian politics since the 1952 Revolution with special emphasis on the interaction of charismatic leadership, ideology, elites, social groups, and institutions. Based predominantly on original Arabic-language sources, the study traces the evolution of the political system from 1952 through the June 1967 War and the aftermath of President Gamal Abd al-Nasir's death in 1970.

The central portion of the book is devoted to Nasir's attempts to build a new order on the basis of the legitimacy of his charisma and according to his new ideological precepts. The various constituent elements of the new revolutionary order—National Union, Arab Socialist Union, National Assembly—are discussed in detail. This section also contains an extensive study of the Egyptian power elite since 1952.
