The division of humanities at UCLA will appoint 4 Andrew W. Mellon Postdoctoral Fellows for a 2-year tenure beginning in fall 2008. Fellows must have earned a doctoral degree between January 2002 and June 2008. The Mellon Fellowship provides a stipend of \$50,000 a year, standard benefits, a moving allowance of \$1,500, and a research budget of \$2,000. Designed to explore the field of Transnational Studies, the Mellon Program at UCLA aims to broaden the study of minority cultures from its national focus to global and comparative perspectives. We seek scholarship that explores minority cultures as components of world culture and history, generated by immigrant and minority artists residing in metropolitan centers that reshapes the canons of literature, art, and music in their countries.
