*Latin American Research Briefs*, published by the Land Tenure Center of the University of Michigan appeared for the first time on January 12 1970. Each issue contains a short summary (number one is six pages long) of a study published in full by the Land Tenure Center. The first issue is entitled: "Migration Study in Brazil Shows Nature of Process and Characteristics of Migrants to the Interior" and is a shortened version of the LTC Research Paper No. 35: Comparison of Migrants in Two Rural and an Urban Area of Central Brazil, by E.
