THE object of the Society is to effect for Rome what the Hellenic Society, now for more than half a century, has been doing for Greece. Its scope embraces the history, art and archaeology of Rome, Italy and the Roman Empire, down to about A.D. 700. Mediaeval and Renaissance Italy have been left to other bodies already engaged in carrying on excellent work.

THE JOURNAL OF ROMAN STUDIES.

The Journal of Roman Studies (11 × 7½ inches) is published by the Society in half-yearly parts, and issued gratuitously and post free to all subscribing members. The Journal is sold to non-subscribers at the rate of 30/- per volume or 15/- per part.
