M.Sc. AND CERTIFICATE COURSES IN AUDIOLOGY

The M.Sc. course is intended primarily to train non-medical graduates, or persons with equivalent qualifications, to the level required for posts of scientific officer in the forthcoming Hospital Scientific Service: the course has been approved by the British Society of Audiology and the British Association of Otolaryngologists. The Certificate course is intended primarily to train senior technical and other non-graduate audiological personnel to a level of knowledge and qualification equivalent to that of technical officer.

Fees are: M.Sc. (12 months) £194 for U.K. students, £250 for overseas students; Certificate (6 months) £157 U.K. and overseas. Some M.R.C. studentships will probably be available for U.K. students with 1st or 2nd class honours degrees. The courses start in October of each year.
