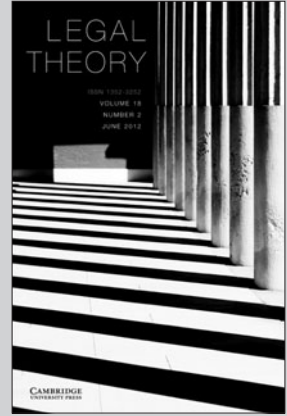

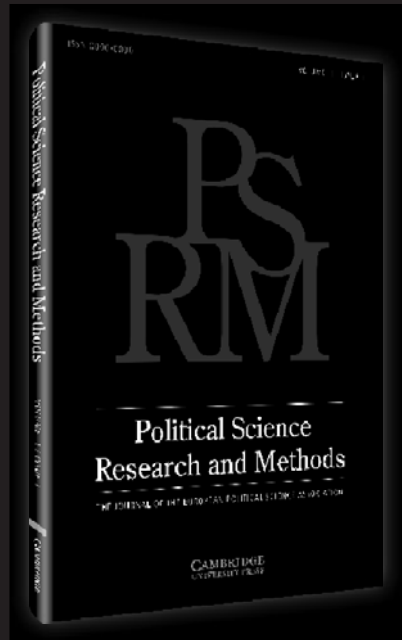

Please include a word count with submission, along with an abstract of approximately 200 words which is not repeated from the paper itself. Please include up to five keywords for the article. Authors should submit an anonymous version stripped of all identifying references to the author(s) that can be sent to reviewers and a separate title page including their contact details. The citation style of the submission should either be Chicago or Harvard Style. Endnotes should not be used.
